

the following morning the salt had all disappeared, having deliquesced during the night, and the Shott looked like an ordinary lake.

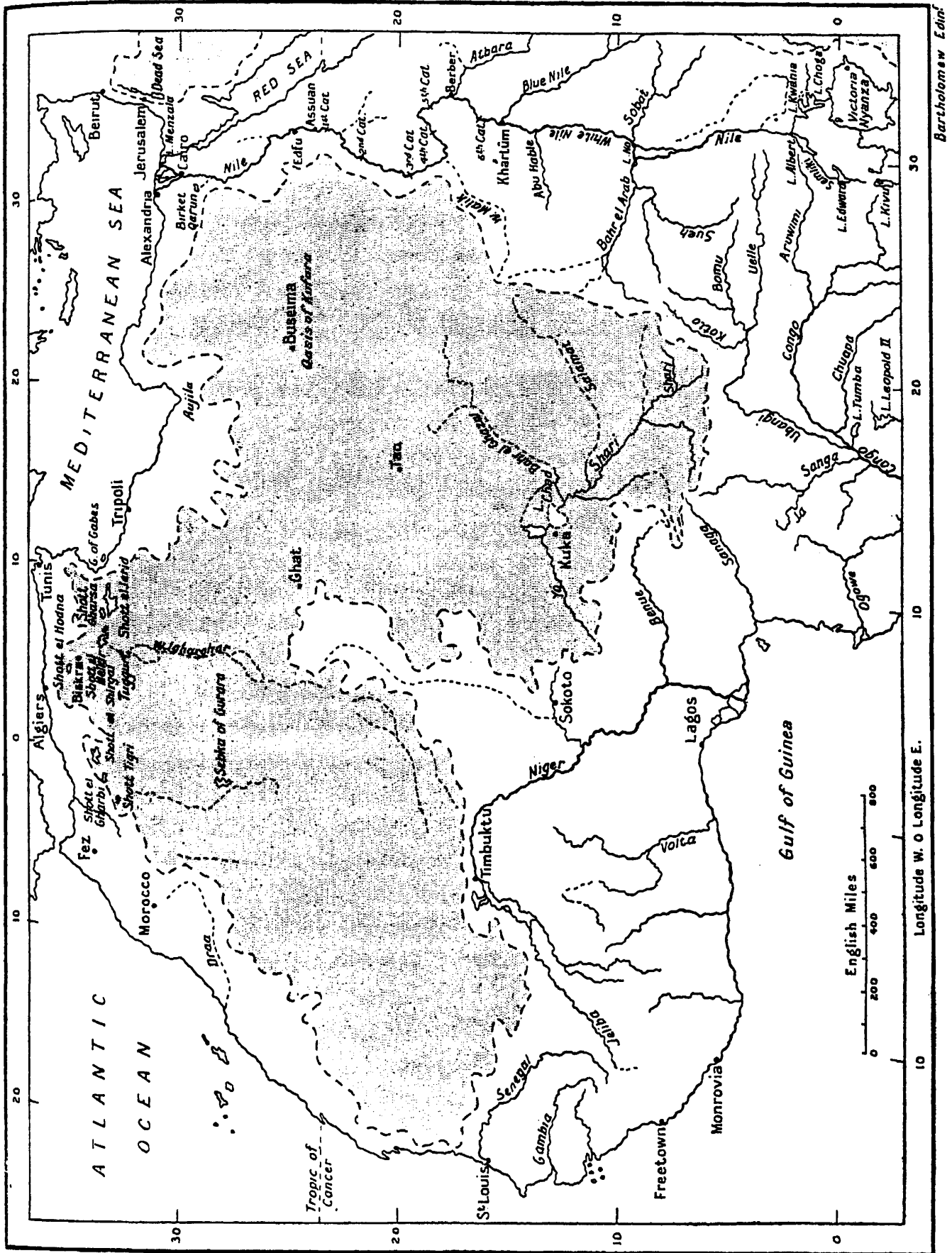


FIG. 65.—In-land drainage area of Northern Africa (Sahara and Sudan).
